

(a) Identify three services provided in this area. (3)


(b) Using map evidence, explain why the settlement has developed at Bindura (4)



3. Study Photograph B2, which shows rocks where biological weathering is taking place.


- (a) Explain why biological and chemical weathering are rapid in areas which are hot and wet. (4)


1. Study Figure B1, which shows the population of four parts of the world in 1960, 2010 and 2060 (projected)

- (iii) A – Decrease in population between 2010 and 2060; and  
B – Increase most in population between 2010 and 2060 (2)
- (iv) Describe three different problems caused by population growth. (3)

2. Study Figure B2, which shows the birth rate and death rate for Vietnam (an LEDC) between 1960 and 2010.

- (i) Describe the changes in the death rate between 1960 and 2010 in Vietnam. Refer to statistics and years from Fig B2 in your answer. (4)
- (ii) Suggest reasons why the birth rate in LEDCs such as Vietnam is still high compared with MEDCs such as the UK (4)
3. For a named country, explain why the distribution of its population is uneven (6)

1. It is estimated that commercial airlines will transport around 3.6 billion passengers in 2016. Explain the advantages and disadvantages of transporting people in this way.
2. "Climate change is inevitable and its impacts cannot be stopped." Use evidence to outline how far you agree with this statement.
3. Why are some areas of the world at greater risk from tectonic activity?
4. Explain how and why you would expect the employment structure of a country to change as it becomes more economically developed over time.
5. Micro-climates can vary greatly across a city as big as London. Explain how this happens
6. Discuss the impacts of an earthquake that you have studied, as well as how people tried to deal with and manage the aftermath.
7. Explain how the size of a population in a country of your choice is changing, and give the reasons for this change.
8. Discuss the reasons for the geographical variation in the UK's climate.



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
